Ris output includes nearly forty operas, three symphonies, and cham per and vocal music He composed twenty seven settings of the mass, including two requiems (both m C nunor), a setting of the Sighit mater, meteriories psalms, and motels. The Requiem was composed for the ineral services of Joseph II (Munich), held sometime around March 19 1790 and cored for SATB soli, SATB choir, and orchestra

The prevailing four-part choral texture is written in homophonic style and is contrasted with occasional fugal writing in Kyrie, Osanna and Lux cole & Canonic passages are employed at Lacrimosa and Amen

As is common with other eighteenthcentury composers, Winter employed a concertante treatment of the SATB soli and SATB choir (Dus me Res tremendae, Offertory, and Agnus Deil. The only movement scored for sola vuice is Quid sum miser (tenor). The elaborate solo writing exhibits some of the melodic ornateness of the Neupolitan style and includes two short recitative like passages.

The orchestral accompaniment provides a strong rhythnuc impulat for the choral matrix, but rarely rises above doubling or elaboration of the chard parts One of the interesting features of this work is the presence of both Latin and German texts, indicating that the work was probably patromed in the vernacular language when done locally
